Faculty plays an important role in guiding students in the event of an emergency. The information below is intended to assist faculty with emergency preparedness in a classroom or lab and should be reviewed with students at the beginning of each semester.
WHAT TO KNOW AT THE BEGINNING OF A NEW SEMESTER
<ul> <li>BUILDING EVACUATION ROUTES AND EVACUATION ASSEMBLY POINTS</li> <li>Building evacuation routes and evacuation assembly points are posted at stairwell and building exits and may also be reviewed and printed at <u>www.sdsu.edu/prepare</u>.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>BUILDING DOORS AND WINDOWS</li> <li>Become aware of how classroom doors and windows operate. Due to the varying age of campus buildings, doors may lock manually, remotely, or not at all.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION</li> <li>Dial 9-1-1 from any phone for emergencies. You will be connected with SDSU Police.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>✓ EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION</li> <li>&gt; Information about a campus emergency will be initiated as soon the situation allows and may be communicated using a variety of methods, including text message, outdoor loud speakers, SDSU Home page, recorded emergency information line.</li> <li>&gt; Signup to receive emergency notification via text message at www.sdsu.edu/ealert.</li> <li>&gt; Outdoor loud speakers may not be audible indoors; refer to the SDSU Home page at www.sdsu.edu for information and updates.</li> <li>&gt; Program the recorded Emergency Information Line, 1-866-794-8832 into your cell phone.</li> </ul>
WHAT TO DO DURING A DRILL OR AN ACTUAL EMERGENCY
<ul> <li>BUILDING ALARM – EVACUATE</li> <li>FIRE – EVACUATE</li> <li>FIRE – EVACUATE</li> <li>POWER OUTAGE – EVACUATE IF INSTRUCTED TO DO SO</li> <li>EARTHQUAKE – DROP, COVER, AND HOLD ON UNDER A DESK OR AGAINST AN INSIDE WALL (PROTECT HEAD AND NECK)</li> <li>HAZARDOUS MATERIAL RELEASE (INDOORS) – EVACUATE</li> <li>HAZARDOUS MATERIAL RELEASE (OUTDOORS) – SHELTER IN PLACE</li> <li>EVACUATION PROCEDURES</li> <li>Evacuate using the nearest exit.</li> <li>Secure any hazardous materials or equipment before leaving.</li> <li>Take personal belongings.</li> <li>WALK – DO NOT RUN. DO NOT USE ELEVATORS.</li> <li>Assiet individuals with disabilities.</li> <li>Assiet individuals with disabilities.</li> <li>Assiet individuals with disabilities.</li> <li>Assemble at the building evacuation assembly point unless otherwise instructed.</li> <li>Provide emergency personnel with relevant information.</li> <li>Remain at evacuation assembly point and do not re-enter building until authorized by emergency personnel.</li> </ul>
✓ ACTIVE SHOOTER / VIOLENT INTRUDER – SHELTER IN PLACE OR EVACUATE IF SAFE TO DO SO NOTE: SHELTER IN PLACE AND EVACUATION PROCEDURES ARE DIFFERENT FOR THIS TYPE OF SITUATION.
