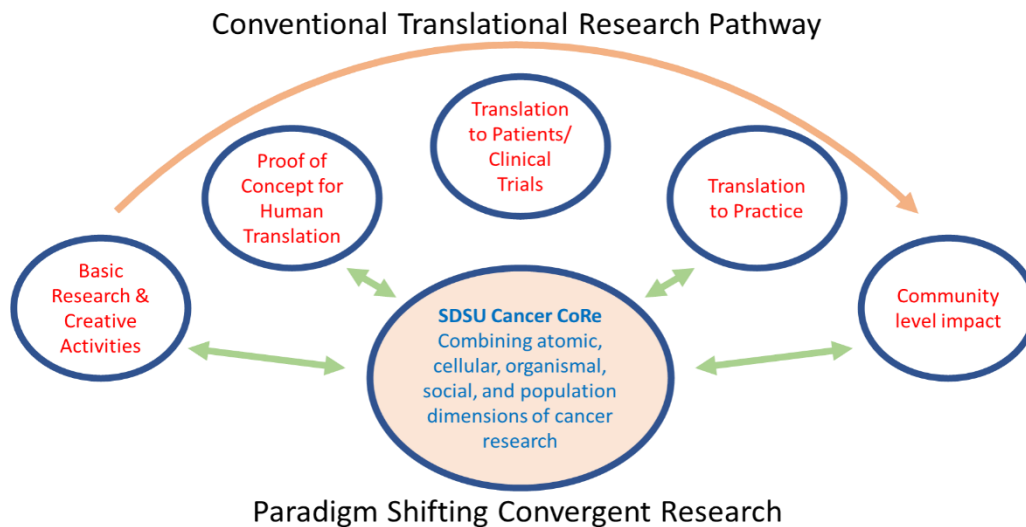


SDSU Cancer CoRe (Convergent Research)

- Are you interested in collaborating with colleagues in cancer research but are not sure how?

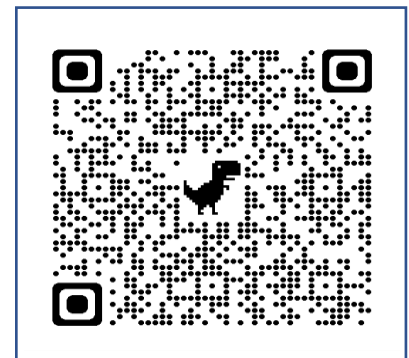
If the answer to any of the above is **yes**, please join us at one of two online information sessions planned by the SDSU Cancer CoRe (Convergent Research). See below for details.
