








RESEARCH DATA — AWARDS (07/01/21 — 09/30/2021)











HISTORICAL DATA - TOTAL DOLLARS






HISTORICAL DATA — BY FUNDING AGENCIES






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
HISTORICAL DATA — FEDERAL VS. OTHERS






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
MASTER'S PROGRAMS ENROLLMENT






ENGINEERING JDP ENROLLMENT






GRADUATE PROGRAMS TOTAL ENROLLMENT

TUITION FEE CONTRIBUTION FROM GRANTS MANAGED BY SDSURF



Engineering JDP Excellence fee - These funds are used to enhance student academic support services, advisement, and experience both in and out of the classroom. The funds are also used to organize workshops that focus on the preparation of fellowship applications. In addition, the funds support graduate students training to improve their participation and competitiveness in securing research funding, preparing graduate students to become the next generation of scholars and career professionals.




Enrollment Trends



FRESHMAN ENROLLMENT TRENDS
















Highest DFW Courses Attended by Engineering Students in Fall 2020


Highest DFW Courses Attended by Engineering Students in Spring 2021




FOUR YEAR GRADUATION RATES







By Gender






Female Students: $15.4\% \rightarrow 20.8\%$

By Ethnicity






Hispanic Students: $23.2\% \rightarrow 29.4\%$






